



2020 November – Majhigaun progress report - 18 houses projectLeave no family behind - Supporting vulnerable families to rebuild new homes!

Out of 88 earthquake affected families in Majhigaun nearly half have now rebuilt new, safe homes! The poorest families are the ones struggling the most to rebuild and they are still living in small, unhealthy temporary shelters. With your support we are now helping another 18 vulnerable, earthquake affected families build new, safe homes in the poor village Majhigaun in Nepal!

1. Shyam Bdr and Apsara Majhi (disabled)

Shyam and Apsara (40 and 28 y/o) are living in a small temporary shed with their two sons Navin and Namee who is handicapped. Their only income is small farming and sometimes working as daily labour in construction. They recently moved into their new home and are very happy to live in a new, safe home!

2. Chandra Bahadur and Patali Majhi (elderly)

Chandra bdr and Patali (65+55 y/o) have been living in a temporary shed made of concrete block. Besides small farming Chandra, the husband, is sometimes working as daily labour in construction to provide for his family. They are struggling to make ends meet but the new house has made this family hopeful of a better future.

3. Krishna and Mithu Majhi (elderly)

Krishna and Mithu Majhi (68 + 62 y/o) are an elderly couple that have been living in a small temporary shed since the earthquake. Besides small farming Krishna, the husband, is sometimes working as daily labour in construction to provide for them. They are struggling to make ends meet but the new house has made this family hopeful of a better future!

4. Amina and Dil Majhi

Dil Bdr and Amina (46 y/o) are living in a small unhealthy temporary shed with their two children Dishan (7 yrs.) and Deepshika (2 yrs.). The family is dependent on Dil Bdr income as truck driver. They have been living in a small temporary shelter for the last 4.5 years. They are very grateful for our support and are now enjoying their new house!

5. Rana and Binda Majhi

Rana lives together with his wife Binda, their son Mithun, Daughter in law Sangita Majhi and Granddaughter Muskan. The family is fully dependent on the son's income as a driver. They have been living in a small temporary shelter since the earthquake.

Lalmani and Maili Majhi (62 + 58 y/o) with two sons Lila and Bishnu are living in a small unhealthy temporary shed. Lalmani, the husband, is sometimes working as daily labour. They are eager to move into their new home!

7. Mangali Maya Majhi and Bhim Bahadur Majhi

Mangali Maya (58 y/o) lives together with her husband in a temporary shelter after the devastating earthquake in 2015. They have small backyard farming from which they hardly earn their living for few months. They have two sons and a daughter in law who lives separately and don't look after them. Mangali Maya has problems with her foot. They are very happy for their new house!

8. Laxmi and Dirgh Raj Majhi

Dirga Raj and Laxmi Majhi are living in a small temporary shed with their two children Ashik (15 yrs.) and Aman (17 yrs.). Dirga Raj is working in Kathmandu on daily basis work and sometimes working as daily labour in construction in the village to provide for his family. They have recently moved into their new home!

9. Bal Krishna Majhi (elderly)

Bal Krishna, of age 63, is living in a small temporary shelter with his son Dev and two daughters Ram-Laxmi and Hira-Mati (14 + 17 + 19 y/o). Their income is limited to small daily farming and sometimes working as daily labours. With our support they are well on their way to completing their new house!

10. Chandra Bahadur and Dhana Maya Majhi (elderly couple)

Chandra Bahadur Majhi (66 y/o) lives together with his wife Dhana Maya Majhi (66 y/o) in a broken house after 2015 earthquake. They don't have any income and are dependent on their daughter and son in law for their daily expenses and food.

11. Laxman & Sakuntala Majhi

Laxman and Sakuntala Majhi of age 38 are living in a small unhealthy temporary shed with their two children Sun bdr (15 yrs.) and Urmila Majhi (17 yrs.). Besides small farming Laxman, is sometimes working as daily labour in construction. They have limited means to construct a new house and risk living in temporary shelter for many years.

12. Ganga and Dal bahadur Majhi

Dal Bahadur Majhi (40 y/o) lives together with his wife Ganga Majhi (35 y/o), son Kumar Majhi (17 y/o), daughter in law Amrita Majhi (16 y/o), grandson Rajkumar Majhi (3 months), son Pawan Majhi (15 y/o) and daughter Khusi Majhi (4 y/o) in a temporary shelter after the 2015 earthquake. Dal Bahadur and his son Kumar works as helpers in construction works to earn their living.

13. Asmita and Nir Kumar Majhi

Asmita Majhi (20 y/o) lives together with her husband Nir Kumar Majhi (24 y/o) in a temporary shelter after 2015 earthquake. They work as helper in construction labour and crusher industry to earn their living. They don't have government grant and neither capable of building on their own. Besides our support, Asmita's father has promised to support them to build their home to some extent.

14. Roya Bahadur & Maili Majhi (disabled & elderly couple)


Roya bdr of age 67 and Maili of age 62 are living in a small one room stone-mud house broken by the earthquake. Roya, who is handicapped, with his wife Maili are struggling to make ends meet. They have no other family to help them. With our support they soon have a new, safe house to live in!

15. Dal Bahadur & Santa Maya Majhi

Dal bdr and Santa Majhi are living in a in a temporary shelter with their son Ramhari Majhi, daughter-in-law Chameli and a grandson. They are living a tough life with only income of small-scale farming. The son works as daily labour in nearby area for feeding the family.

16. Kanchhi Majhi (Single Mother)

Kanchi, a single mother of 55, is living in a small temporary shed with her son Ram Krishna, daughter-in-law Renu and her grandson Rajen (26 + 24 + 4 years old). Their income is limited to small family farming and the son sometimes working in construction. Due to their limited financials they have been unable to build a new house.

17. Juna & Prem Bahadur Majhi

Prem bdr and Juna (35 + 32 y/o) are living in a small unhealthy temporary shed with their 3-year-old daughter Premiki and 14-years-old son Anil. Besides small farming Prem is sometimes working as daily labour in construction or road construction to provide for his family. They have no means to construct a new house and risk living in temporary shelter for many years to come.
